





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Cutting

Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

WOF= Width of Fabric • LOF = Length of Fabric

Fabric A (5159P-90 Snowman Panel - Gray):

• Fussy cut (1) 22" x 31" WOF strip centered on the panel.

Fabric B (5168-88 Swirl-Red), cut:

- (6) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.
- (2) 2" x 31" WOF strips.
- (2) 2" x 25" WOF strips.
- (3) 2" x WOF strips, sub-cut (12) 2" x 10 1/4" strips.
- (4) 2" x WOF strips, sub-cut (12) 2" x 11 3/4" strips.
- (1) 1 3/8" x WOF strip, sub-cut (8) 1 3/8" x 2 1/2" strips.
- (1) 1 1/4" x WOF strip, sub-cut (4) 1 1/4" x 6" strips.
- (3) 1 $\frac{1}{4}$ " x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 $\frac{1}{4}$ " x 55 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips.

Fabric C (5164-98 Tossed Bird Houses – Black), cut:

- (2) 6" x 31" WOF strips.
- (1) 5 ¾" x WOF strip, sub-cut (4) 5 ¾" squares.

Fabric D (5161-98 Large Blocks - Multi):

• Fussy cut (6) 8 ³/₄" x 10 ¹/₂" strips each centered on a block.

Fabric E (5171-98 Buffalo Plaid – Red), cut:

• (1) 2 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (4) 2 ½" x 10 ½" strips.

Fabric F (5163-98 Border Stripe - Multi), cut:

- (2) 5 ³/₄" x 55 ¹/₂" LOF strips.
- (2) 5 ³/₄" x 36" LOF strips.

Backing (5160-98 Snowmen Patch - Multi), cut:

• (2) 74" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together and trim to 54" x 74" to make the back.



Sew using a ¼" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise indicated. Always press towards the darker fabric while assembling, unless otherwise noted by the arrows.

Block Assembly

Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the direction of the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components.

- 1. Sew (1) 2" x 31" Fabric B strip to each side of the 22" x 31" Fabric A panel. Sew (1) 2" x 25" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A panel. Trim the block to measure 23 ½" x 32 ½" to make the Center Block (Fig. 1).
- 2. Sew (1) 1 ¼" x 6" Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of (1) 6" x 31" Fabric C strip to make (1) Unit 1 strip (Fig. 2). Repeat to make a second Unit 1 strip.
- 3. Sew (1) 2" x 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip to each side of (1) 8 $\frac{3}{4}$ " x 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric D strip. Sew (1) 2" x 11 ¾" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric D strip. Trim the block to measure 10 ½" x 12" to make (1) Unit 2 rectangle (Fig. 3). Repeat to make (6) Unit 2 rectangles total.




4. Sew (1) 1 3/8" x 2 1/2" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of (1) 2 1/2" x 10 1/4" Fabric E strip to make (1) Unit 3 strip (Fig. 4). Repeat to make (4) Unit 3 strips total.



5. Sew together (3) Unit 2 rectangles and (2) Unit 3 strips, lengthwise and alternating them, to make (1) Unit 4 strip (Fig. 5). Repeat to make a second Unit 4 strip.



Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)


- 6. Sew (1) Unit 1 strip to each side of the Center Block.
- 7. Sew (1) Unit 4 strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
- 8. Sew (1) 1 $\frac{1}{4}$ " x 55 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip to each side of the Center Block.
- 9. Sew (1) $5\frac{3}{4}$ " x $55\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric F strip to each side of the Center Block.
- 10. Sew (1) 5 $\frac{3}{4}$ " Fabric C square to each end of (1) 5 $\frac{3}{4}$ " x 36" Fabric F strip. Repeat to make a second strip. Sew the strips to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.

Layering, Quilting and Finishing

11. Press the quilt top and 54" x 74" backing well. Layer backing (wrong side up), batting, pressed quilt top (right side up) and baste. Quilt as desired and trim excess batting and backing when quilting is complete.

Binding

- 12. Cut the ends of the (6) Fabric B binding strips at a 45-degree angle and sew end to end to make (1) continuous piece of binding. Fold in half lengthwise and press wrong sides together.
- 13. Sew the binding to the front of the quilt, raw edges together. Turn the folded edge to the back, and hand stitch in place.
